



Sure, it would be nice for the sojourn to continue, but the fact of the matter is it does not. That's confirmed by the fact that since 2004 these division "worst-to-first" squads have gone a measly 74-97-4 ATS overall in follow-up campaigns.

... we'd be sitting on a potential lottery ticket as these home chalk artists have gone 48-74-3 in this rile since 2004, including **15-33 ATS** in division contests. Last year the Cincinnati Bengals dressed up four times in this role as a division home favorite and responded by going **1-3 ATS**.

For what it's worth, Jacksonville hosts **Carolina** this weekend, with the Jaguars looking more like the 2021

CLEVELAND over NY Jets by 10

Since veteran Joe Flacco became the starting quarterback of the Cleveland Browns (10-5), receiver Amari Cooper and tight end David Njoku have absolutely incinerated opponents. Cooper, in particular, has dominated. Against Houston, he hauled in 11 passes for a Browns' single-game record 265 yards, giving him 451 yards and three touchdowns over the last three games. And speaking of Flacco, no quarterback in the league has thrown for more yards than in his seven contests with Cleveland. Meanwhile, they have gone longer without a division crown (1989) than any team in the league. They are not going to catch Baltimore, but a win tonight sews up Cleveland's third postseason since joining the league as an expansion team in 1999. The parade of injuries to the league's most injured crew continues to pile up with the valuable leg of PK Dustin Hopkins (hamstring; 33/36 FG attempts, including 8-for-8 from 50+ yards) and punter Corey Bojorquez (quad) both in question at press time. The Browns signed Riley Patterson, who was waived by the Detroit Lions on Dec. 19. For the Lions this year Patterson was 15-for-17 in field goal attempts and 35-for-37 on extra point attempts. Jets' signal caller Trevor Siemian became the 59th different quarterback to start a game this season when he led the Jets to a 30-28 victory over Washington despite a jawdropping 14 penalties for 150 yards by the Flyboys. Given the Jets **0-5** ATS mark on Thursdays, and 3-9 ATS effort after hosting NFC foes, plus their 5-11 SUATS mark in games when coming off a win under Robert Saleh – along with Cleveland's 6-1 ATS mark at home on Thursdays and its recent 5-0 SUATS mark in the Dawg Pound since their Bye week this season – we'll be brown bagging it tonight.

Saturday, December 30

5★ BEST BET

DALLAS over Detroit by 16

Detroit clinched its first division title since 1993 last week and now has its sights set higher. After turning the page, the team will focus their attentions on securing as high a playoff-seed as possible. This is, however, the first time in the franchise's 94-season history that it has managed 20 regular-season wins over a two-year period. Add it all up, and it sounds like a bit too much champagne to us. Based on common opponents the Lions are currently 3-1 and the Eagles 4-2 this season. Thus, they will hold the tiebreaker over Philadelphia in the NFC Playoff race should they win out. The problem today, though, is the recently-scorched Cowboys currently sit one game behind both the Eagles and Lions and are looking to crash the party. They are also riding a 15-0 SU and 12-3 ATS run at Jerry's World, including a 5-0 ATS log when coming off a loss. Detroit enters 1-5 ATS away when coming off an away game, while the 'Boys are 5-1 ATS against the NFC North. Better yet, the Cowboys are 12-6 ATS since 1990 at home in Last Home Games against foes coming off a win, including 8-0 SU and 7-1 ATS with a .600 or greater win percentage. We saved the best for last, though, with THE CLINCHER: Dallas is 10-1 SUATS as a favorite in games when coming off a loss, including 6-0 SUATS against foes coming off a win.

4★ BEST BET

Miami over BALTIMORE by 8

It may have been ugly, but Dolphins head coach Mike McDaniel could care less. All we know is last week's 22-20 slugfest over Dallas kept his team one game back of the top seed in the AFC Playoff Picture. And don't discount their chances today. The Fish have won the stats each of their last eight games while surrendering 244 YPG in the process. Suddenly, Vic Fangio's defense is taking center stage over Miami's famed offense. Should the Dolphins win out, they will hoist up the AFC East crown. That may be a tall order, though, for a team off its first win this season against a winning foe who will taking on Buffalo next week. Baltimore returns home off its statement-making win over the 49ers last week knowing that all three of the Ravens' losses this season were certainly winnable - one in overtime, another by two points and the other by a touchdown. Still, despite last week's romp over San Francisco, the Niners are still favored to win this year's Super Bowl at +200 at the SuperBook in Las Vegas, ahead of Baltimore at +400 and Miami at +700. Just to prove the Ravens are real, they've defeated all three NFC teams in their schedule that are currently seeds in the NFC Playoff Picture - San Francisco, L.A. Rams, and Seattle. A monster 5-0 turnover edge keyed the Black Birds' upset win last week as they are now on a +9 net TO edge in their last four contests. The problem today, though, is that Baltimore is just 7-7 SU and 4-10 ATS laying points in its last 14 games when coming off a win as an underdog – including 1-9 ATS against foes with at least one win on the season and **0-8 ATS** as a favorite of three or more points. That fits like a glove for the Dolphins and their 16-4 ATS mark as a non-division road dog of 5 or fewer points. With Miami **8-1 ATS** as a dog after dressing up as a favorite, we'll be on the take today. On a sidebar note: Pro Football Talk's Mike Florio, easily the biggest wannabe know-it-all proved he knows nothing when it comes to picking winners. On his pregame prediction of last week's 49ers-Ravens clash, Florio said, "The 49ers kick the (expletive) out of the Ravens on Monday night. I'm sorry. I know that's disrespectful to the Ravens, but let's be realistic. They've got to fly across the country on Christmas night, and the 49ers are waiting. And the 49ers are going to dismantle the Ravens," Florio said. We're not sure what pictures Florio has of NBC executives, but the guy proved he is clueless. However, getting back to the point we point to THE CLINCHER: Baltimore is 0-3 ATS as a home favorite behind Lamar Jackson when coming off a SU underdog win.





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BUFFALO over New England by 8

True to their leader, the Pats refuse to fold the tent, as last week's upset win at Denver marked the fifth time in the last six games they've outgained an opponent. New England's win over the Broncos was an absolute disaster for New England as it will likely prove costly to their status in the 2024 NFL Draft. The Patriots have been in the running for the top pick all season, but their hopes of getting said pick are all but finished. They are now two games ahead of the Panthers with as many games to go. Following Sunday's action, the Patriots now hold the No. 4 pick in April's draft behind the Arizona Cardinals and Washington Commanders as they lose a tiebreaker to the latter. For a very long time now, there have been two can'tmiss quarterback prospects in this draft with USC's Caleb Williams and North Carolina's Drake Maye. The Patriots have been in prime position all season to draft one of those two as their quarterback of the future, but not anymore. If the Patriots win another game, which is very possible with a home game against the New York Jets to close the season, they could find themselves picking as low as No. 7. You can rest assured the higher-ups in the New England organization were not happy with last week's results, and while a win in Buffalo on Sunday appears dim, the Pats could be on the verge of falling out of the Top 10 in this year's draft. On the other side of the field, winners of three in a row and four of five, Buffalo will be a playoff team with two more wins, and might even win a fourth straight AFC East title but will need the Miami Dolphins to lose to Baltimore. Hence, there could be a tad of scoreboard watching today, and if so, you don't want to be laying any unnecessary lumber in this tilt. Not with Buffalo riding a 0-7 ATS log as double-digit chalk. Take it if you play it.

Atlanta over CHICAGO by 3

The Falcons turned to backup QB Taylor Heinicke last week when the Desmond Ridder project was finally put on hold. Heinicke made his third start of the season in Week 16 and turned in his best performance of the year. The veteran signal-caller completed nearly 70 percent of his passes for 229 yards, one touchdown, and zero turnovers. While many of his completions were at or near the line of scrimmage, the bottom line is the Dirty Birds improved to 3-2 since their Bye week, and their playoff hopes still remain on life support as they are still alive as the No. 9 seed in the NFC Playoff Picture, thanks to losses by the Saints and Vikings last week. Meanwhile, the Bears have quietly gone 6-1 ATS in their last seven games thanks to a defense that has surrendered 21 PPG in the process, and at 6-9 in the season are mathematically alive in this year's NFC playoff race. However, QB Justin Fields brings a 3-7 SU and 2-7-1 ATS career mark in his NFL career in games in which he is not taking 3 or more points. With Atlanta entering 7-1 ATS in the first of back-to-back road games, and Chicago 1-4-1 ATS in its last six games against the NFC South, we'll take a flier with the Falcons.

HOUSTON over Tennessee by 8

Despite three losses in the past five games, the Texans remain in the thick of the AFC playoff race, sitting at No. 8 entering this second-to-last week of the season. They received promising news earlier in the week when it was announced that rookie phenom

QB C.J. Stroud would be practicing this week as he looks to shake the cloudiness of being in concussion protocol the past two weeks. While its path to the playoffs is murky due to Week 16 losses by the Indianapolis Colts and Jacksonville Jaguars, Houston is still in control of its destiny. Veteran quarterback Case Keenum could not replicate his success from the previous week. Before being benched in favor of Davis Mills, Keenum finished with 11-of-17 for 62 yards, with two interceptions and a 31.6 passer rating. Hence, Mattress Mack and sports fans in Houston anxiously hold their breath awaiting his playing status today. The Texans have cashed in 5 of the last 6 games in this series and are 5-0 ATS when coming off a home loss. With Tennessee going nowhere other than home to host Jacksonville next week to conclude a disappointing season, look for the Titans to tumble to 0-8 ATS in games before facing the Jaguars – assuming C.J. is back behind center today.

UPSET GAME OF THE WEEK UPSET

Las Vegas over INDIANAPOLIS by 6

The Colts and Raiders are familiar with each other, as this Sunday will be the third straight matchup in three consecutive seasons, albeit with three different head coaches in as many seasons for Las Vegas. It's important to remember that while the Colts currently hold down the No. 7 and final seed in the AFC Playoff Picture, the Raiders are still mathematically alive in the playoff chase. They also own the better points differential this season than Indianapolis and seem to have taken to interim coach Antonio Pierce, going 4-3 SU and 5-1-1 ATS since he took the reins at the beginning of November. The Well-Oiled Machine chips in noting that dogs seeking revenge in the penultimate week of the NFL season, coming off a SU underdog win, are 40-19 ATS, including 17-5 ATS against foes coming off a loss. With Indy just 1-6 ATS when hosting AFC West opponents and 3-10 ATS against foes coming off a Monday Night contest, look for the visiting team in this series to improve to 6-0 ATS here. Seconding the motion is THE CLINCHER: The Raiders reside in this week's **INCREDIBLE STAT on page 2.**

JACKSONVILLE over **Carolina** by 1

The Jaquars are in trouble, and they know it. Not only is QB Trevor Lawrence operating with a sprained shoulder (check his status), but the team is also falling apart at the seams. They have been leaking oil like the Exxon Valdez, bringing a 0-4 SUATS and ITS (In The Stats) ledger in its last four games into this contest. Making matters worse, the Jags are 1-10 ATS in their last eleven home games against NFC opposition, as well as 0-4 ATS as a favorite of more than 7 points. And we didn't even mention Jack's 4-9 SU and 3-10 ATS mark as home chalk the past six seasons. These are not the attributes one looks for when laying a touchdown. Carolina enters with a 10-4 ATS ledger in its last fourteen games against the AFC South, as well as a 3-0 SUATS mark in this series. With the MIDWEEK ALERT reporting the Panthers sport the league's No. 5 overall defense, as opposed to Jacksonville's No. 25 overall defense, the points become the play in this overlay – especially with Marc's **BETCHA DIDN'T KNOW** article fading the Jags as well.

LA Rams over NY GIANTS by 1

The Giants find themselves in the unenviable position of being in the middle of a Philly cheese sandwich today. However, a deeper look at the menu finds Big Blue 9-6 SU and 10-4 ATS in games after facing the Eagles, including **5-0 SUATS** at home. However, it's understandable now that they are officially out of playoff contention, its 0-6 ATS mark against NFC West foes might surface. Before knee-jerking here, though, our Well-Oiled Machine notes that NFL home dogs are 82-50-6 ATS during the penultimate week of the season, including 40-17-1 ATS against non-division foes. With the Rams surging since the return of QB Matthew Stafford following their Bye week (5-1 and holding down the No. 6 seed in the NFC Playoff Picture), they are being priced accordingly. In addition, they sport a winning record for the first time this season. However, they are also **1-5 ATS** after playing on Thursdays. With that, behind QB Tyrod Taylor, look for the G-Men to improve on their 5-0 ATS log when coming off a division road game, as well as 5-1 **ATS** in the first of consecutive home games here today. Hold your nose and grab the points.

PHILADELPHIA over Arizona by 8

It's safe to say that QB Jalen Hurts and WR A.J. Brown pulled the Eagles out of a rut in last week's disapproving 33-25 win over the stubborn New York Giants. But at this stage of the season, it was a badly needed victory as it stopped the bleeding and kept Philly in the chase for the top spot in the NFC playoff seeding. Today, though, they'll need to improve off a lousy 1-5 ATS mark of late against the NFC West and an 0-4 ATS current ATS losing record. With it, the Cardinals enter 10-0 ATS of late against the NFC East, as well as 8-1 ATS of late in this series. Until the Green Birds get their act back together, they are simply too risky to be laying double digits in a NY Giants division sandwich.

3★ BEST BET

New Orleans over TAMPA BAY by 10


It's safe to say that the month of December has been kind to Tampa Bay. The Buccaneers (8-7) have won each of the four games they've played in the final month of 2023, and quarterback Baker Mayfield has been particularly efficient. Ironically, Mayfield's stats this month have overpowered those of new Cleveland super-hero Joe Flacco's 85.1 Passer Rating, as Baker has thrown for 1,010 yards and has posted a 9-to-1 touchdown-to-interception ratio in December, good for a 110.6 QB Rating this month. The Bucs currently hold down the No. 4 seed in the NFC Playoff picture, one leg up on division rivals Atlanta and today's invader, New Orleans. In order for the Saints to avoid missing the playoffs for the third straight season, they know the task at hand. New Orleans must beat both Tampa Bay and Atlanta to finish the year with a 9-8 record. Additionally, the Buccaneers must lose their season finale at the Carolina Panthers. If that scenario plays out, the Saints would be the NFC South champion. If the Saints lose either of their last two contests, they will be officially eliminated from postseason contention. There is no other scenario where New Orleans can win their division. In addition, under head coach Dennis Allen, the Saints also have an ugly 1-13 record against teams that are .500 or better at the time they play them. However, they will enter today's game mathematically alive in the NFC South with a 5-0 ATS record when seeking triple revenge. On the flip side, the Bucs are 0-9 ATS in games before facing the Panthers, as well as 0-5-1 ATS at home off a home game. We saved the best for last, though, with THE CLINCHER: See this week's AWESOME ANGLE on page 2.

San Francisco over WASHINGTON by 10

After falling behind 20-0 for the second consecutive week, the Commanders turned to proven veteran Jacoby Brissett, who went 18-of-23 for 224 yards with three scores in the past two weeks. This week, we expect to see Brissett under center from the get-go and with it he brings a 14-12 SU and 15-10-1 ATS career mark into this contest in home games this season, including 4-0 ATS as a dog of more than three points. Meanwhile, the Niners can breathe a sigh of relief knowing that today's opponent does not reside in the AFC North, against whom the Niners are 0-3 SUATS this season. Despite last week's blood-letting against the Ravens, the 49ers still lead the league in net scoring differential (+177), whereas the Commanders reside at the other end of the spectrum with a -144 net scoring differential. In addition, the 49ers bring a lofty 10-0 ATS record into the contest after hosting an AFC squad and a 5-0 ATS ledger over the last three years in NFC East encounters. However, in the Commanders' defense, much like their division brethren Giants, our Well-Oiled Machine notes that NFL home dogs are 82-50-6 ATS during the penultimate week of the season, including 40-17-1 ATS against non-division foes. That, and Washington's 6-1 ATS mark in games when coming off an ATS win when taking on foes off an ATS loss, is enough to put the stop sign up.

<u>Pittsburgh</u> over SEATTLE by 3

Third string QB Mason Rudolph not only kept the Steelers' playoff hopes alive but also Mike Tomlin's winning-season streak intact with an impressive performance off the bench in last week's scintillating 34-11 victory over Cincinnati. Still, Pittsburgh will face playoff elimination this week for the first time this season but are still in control of keeping their chances alive before the final week of the season. However, they'd need everything to go wrong in order to be out of the race prior to their Week 18 trip to Baltimore. And a win over the Seattle Seahawks today shuts down any chance of them being kicked out of the playoff picture. To put it simply, if the Steelers lose



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and the Colts, Bills, Chargers, and Jaguars, or Texans win, Pittsburgh will be eliminated from the 2023 playoff race. On the other side of the field, Seattle enters off a pair of 20-17 victories over Philadelphia and Tennessee and currently clings to the No. 7 and final playoff seed in the NFC. Ironically, what we didn't mention, though, is the Seabags are on a five-game ITS (In The Stats) losing slide, meaning winning games with smoke and mirrors has become commonplace for Pete Carrol's crew – sort of what the Steelers managed to accomplish until they finally won their first game in the stats against Cincinnati the final week of November. The Black-and-Gold bring a 5-0 ATS mark into this fray after hosting a division foe, while Seattle is 0-4 ATS against opponents coming off a Saturday contest. Finally, the Well-Oiled Machine chips in, noting that dogs in the penultimate week of the NFL season – read: Pittsburgh – coming off a SU underdog win, are 64-44-1 ATS. You know what to do.

KANSAS CITY over Cincinnati by 12

Who would have believed it? The second-to-last week of the season finds these two teams with a combined 13 losses on the season. Yet both are alive in the AFC playoff race, with the Bengals currently resting in the No. 10 slot and the Chiefs precariously holding on to the No. 3 seed. More surprising, Kansas City enters Arrowhead on the three-game home losing skid, a role in which they stand 9-3 SU and 10-2 ATS when arriving off three previous home losses exactly, including 7-0 SUATS versus .540 or greater foes. The good news, though, is a win today wraps up the Chiefs 8th straight division title. Meanwhile, Cincinnati can blame an 0-5 ledger in division games this season on its 'on the outside looking in' playoff standing. They can take solace in knowing they are 5-0 ATS in the second of consecutive road games, and 7-1-1 ATS in their last nine tiffs against AFC West opposition – but more importantly, a repulsive **1-7 ATS** in games when both teams enter off SU losses as a favorite. On the flip side, Kansas City is 4-0 ATS against foes coming off a Saturday contest. Look for the Chiefs to take care of business today.

DENVER over LA Chargers by 2

The Broncos fell to 7-8-1 SU and 3-12-1 ATS as a favorite behind suddenly over-the-hill, 35-year-old QB Russell Wilson, who is likely to sit the final two games of the season to avoid a potential injury and a crippling \$37M salary scheduled in 2024 which he is scheduled to receive next season if he's still on the roster. Adding to the mess, WR Courtland Sutton has entered concussion protocol and is doubtful today. With Jarrett Stidham likely behind center, it doesn't bode well for a team that is currently **0-7 ATS** the last seven games as a division home favorite. And while the Chargers have quarterback issues of their own, they appear revived following the departure of former head coach Brandon Staley. Given L.A.'s 8-2 ATS log when coming off consecutive losses and the Broncos' **1-9 ATS** ledger when laying points in consecutive games, we'll plug in with the Bolts today.

Green Bay over MINNESOTA by 3

The NFL elected not to flex this Sunday Night prime-time contest. Our question is, why would they? These two teams each sit on the perimeter, looking in at the NFL Playoff race. With their 30-24 loss to the Lions on Sunday and the Seahawks' comeback win over the Titans, the banged-up Vikings no longer control their playoff destiny. Even if they win out, they'll need either the Rams or Seahawks to lose a game to setup a potential tiebreaker. Nick Mullens, the Vikings' fourth starting quarterback this season, threw four more interceptions in the Detroit loss, including a duck that ended hopes of a miraculous comeback in the final minute. Down the stretch, Mullens was missing two of his top three targets in T.J. Hockenson (out for the season with a knee injury) and Jordan Addison, who both left Sunday's contest with lower-

body injuries. Right tackle Brian O'Neill was also out. Defensively, the Vikings came into the day without top cornerback Byron Murphy Jr. and then lost starters Mekhi Blackmon and D.J. Wonnum to injuries during the game. Meanwhile, the Packers' defense is beginning to unravel, surrendering season-high yards in each of its last two games. Minnesota is just 1-4 in its last five games, but to their credit, the four losses have come by a total of 12 points, and they won the stats in four of the five contests, and the Vikings also beat the Packers, 24-10, in Green Bay two months ago. However, with the Packers 5-1 ATS in their last six games as a division road dog, and 4-0 ATS when coming off a road win. They are also 23-12-1 ATS in their last 36 Sunday Night contests, including 11-2-1 ATS against foes coming off a SUATS loss. Minnesota's 2-8 ATS mark in its last ten home games seals it.



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
